October General Club Meeting.

Trevor Williams from Woodfinish Management demonstrated the Kreg jig. The Kreg jig is a pocket hole joinery system. The jigs and special drill allow you to drill holes and insert screws for joining boards together. The use of special screws that are self drilling and have flat heads allows boards to be screwed together. The system is particularly suitable for man-made boards, but can be used for hard and soft woods as well. He has not experienced much demand in the local market, which he finds surprising, given the large volumes sold in the USA. One possible explanation may be that the kitchen cabinet



designs are different. In SA we use the Euro system with drawers and doors that overlay the fronts of the units. In the US, face-frames are fashionable. A face-frame is a square frame that overlays the front of the cabinet with the doors either flush or overlaying the frame. These frames are very easily assembled on site using the Kreg system.

Toys should be painted with lead free paints and avoid sharp edges and points that can injure. Target ages range from 2 to 12 years. Pullalong or push-along toys, small cabinets or boxes, small puzzles, small wheel barrows, etc are most effective.
