<u>News</u>

5th October - Turner's meeting. Captive Deep Hollowing Tool. Chris van Heeswijk explained the difficulties and techniques for deep hollowing. He showed a number of tools specially designed for deep hollowing and explained the relative merits and difficulties of each. Tool control becomes increasingly difficult as the depth of the vessel increases: leverage and vibration seem to increase out of proportion to the distance. Chris noted there are about 30 different hollowing systems on the market. To assist the turner, a number of captive hollowing tools have been developed. Chris imported one example from Harrison specialties in the USA, with a laser guide. He showed the principles of operation and how to control wall thickness using the laser.

Wood of the Month -Clanwilliam Cedar.

Widdringtonia walichii – previously W. cedarbergensis. Endemic to the Cedarberg mountains of the Western Cape. Ironically, the mountains were named after the cedar trees, which have almost disappeared due to overexploitation. Classed as critically endangered, the trees are being replanted in a program by Cape Nature. It is similar to cypress trees in appearance with cones and fragrant wood. It was widely used outdoors for telephone poles due its durability.



14th October - Club meeting. Safety topics: Noise, dust and welding hazards. Neels Pretorius explained how people

become injured and disabled through exposure to a variety of hazards in the workshop. Noise-induced hearing loss is easily avoidable, provided people are diligent about wearing hearing protection. Neels explained how noise causes long term damage and how to protect against it. He also explained some of the hazards of wood dust and to avoid them. Although not a topic close to wood working, hazards from arc welding were also explained, as most of us are exposed to them at some stage of their lives.
