Turner’s Meeting

John Speedy demonstrated a miniature version of the technique shown by Jo Winter called “Shadow Turning”. John showed some of the special scrapers he made to fit into the small dimensions of the work-piece. He used basically the same process shown by Jo, but it seemed less scary at the smaller scale. Due to the smaller size, John was able to simplify the work-holding, using a dowel to hold the blank to start with.

Wood of month – Chris van Heeswijk presented Black Walnut – *Juglans nigra* – and European Walnut – *Juglans Regia*. In addition to the wood and nuts, walnut oil is also a product of the tree. Walnut oil is used as a salad dressing. It is a drying oil and does not go rancid, so it may be used for finishing wooden items that will be in contact with food.

To prevent the child sliding out of the chair, a large knob is installed in the front of the seat. BAND SAW FENCE

This fence is nothing more than a big T-square made from hardwood scrap. It needs no rails because it slides against two panhead machine screws in the cast-iron table. I added locknuts to mine so the fence can be adjusted for blade drift by screwing the bolts in or out.

I found the fence so useful that I added a taller fence for resawing. If your band saw table does not have threaded holes as shown, drill and tap them.
